AB 3251 SEC.2 Section 3711 of the Labor Code is amended to read: 3711 (a) Every employer who applies for any license or the renewal of any license for a business issued pursuant to Section 37101 of the Government Code or Section 7284 of the Revenue and Taxation Code shall complete and sign a declaration that states the following:
